Both the NFEC and CERID have successfully executed this much needed action and thereby contributed towards establishing an effective coordination and collaboration mechanism among the policy makers, experts, researchers and organizations involved in literacy and Non-Formal Education programme in Nepal.

On behalf of UNESCO Office in Kathmandu, I would like to express my sincere appreciation to NFEC and CERID for their support extended towards preparing this inventory. I hope that this will result in the formation of a strong network of concerned stakeholders to identify and strengthen the non-formal education/literacy practices in Nepal.

An Inventory of Non-Formal Education in Nepal

Background

The pace of NFE expansion in Nepal started in the mid-seventies when CERID launched an innovative project 'education for rural transformation' in Lahachok VDC of Kaski District. Then in the late seventies after reflecting on the positive outcomes of the Lahachok project CERID launched the 'integrated non-formal education project' in five different districts in Nepal. This project was successful specifically in producing substantive learning materials based on contextual needs and in developing learner-centered methodology. These achievements proved to be landmarks paving the way for expeditious operation of NFE activities in Nepal. Consequently, government as well as nongovernmental sectors strove to establish NFE delivery structures in such a rapid manner, at a gallop pace. Now we can see thousands of NGOs and several I-NGOs which are involved in NFE programs. Today, in Nepal, there are numerous NGOs and I-NGOs involved in runing non-formal education programs. Conceivably, the focus of these programs is on human development with emphasis on fostering human skills in areas such as health, education, social living, awareness building, income generation, civic awareness, human rights, etc. It seems that these organizations have used their own modus operandi to conduct NFE activities. In other words, they hardly tend to accredit the importance of mutual sharing and co-operation, no matter how emphatically they might have expressed the essentiality of mutual partnership -- in words. One of the major reasons in this regard may be that they there is very little room for them to know each other. Therefore, a profile stating their backgrounds, objectives, operation methods, worksites, funding sources, nature and composition of participants, achievements, etc. would certainly provide them opportunity to know each other. To get to know each other is certainly a start point paving the way for mutual exchange of support and co-operation in the future. To this end, the initiative taken by UNESCO Country Office Nepal to develop a NFE inventory is a pertinent endeavor. CERID, with the support of UNESCO Country Office Nepal, is conducting this project with focus on the following objective.

Objective

The main objective of the project is to develop an inventory NGOs and I-NGOs involved in NFE activities. The profiles included in this inventory is expected to provide a base on which to expand networking and linkage between various organizations. Since this project is an important initiative, its operation should be advanced with greater impetus and precision for which a systematic data collection approach is essential. With this in view the following strategies were adopted.

Strategies adopted for data collection

A data collection form (questionnaire) (See Appendix 1) was developed after reflecting on the types of data required for developing the profile. A preliminary discussion in this respect was held with the UNESCO Country Representative at the UNESCO Country Office. Later, a draft tool was developed and disseminated to related stakeholders. Taking into consideration the further inputs that were suggested, the final version of the tool was developed.

A two-member field research team including a senior researcher as the project coordinator was formed to explore potential sources of data, to monitor the data collection activity and to systematize the data collected. The research team found it tough to identify right sources of data, since no systematic data base on NFE organizations was in place.

Personal contact was considered appropriate to explore further NFE-related organizations and reach out to them for data collection. Priority was given to studying official records and also to interviewing rather than to leaving the question naire with the identified respondent and wait until the data were filled in.

A Research Steering Committee consisting of 5 members was formed with CERID Executive Director as the chairperson. Other committee members included Director of NFEC (HMG), UNESCO representative, SWC (Social Welfare Council) representative and the research coordinator. The rationale behind including a representative from SWC was to get, through his facilitation, easy access to the records of NFE organizations which should be available at SWC, since any NGO or I-NGO that planed to conduct community development activities have to be affiliated with it for which they must submit necessary documents.

In the steering committee meeting held at CERID it was decided that the NFE Center, HMG would put up an advertisement in the media asking all NGOs to furnish details of what they were doing. This might seem worthwhile because the NFE Center, which is the support-providing authority to NFE-related NGOs, would be heeded by them in the expectation of obtaining necessary data and information. This approach will be followed in course of continuing this work in the future.

Data analysis

A total of 242 organizations – 12 I-NGOs and 230 NGOs – were identified. Of them 198 NGOs were identified from the records maintained at SWC. Actually, it is necessary for every NGO to get grant of affiliation from SWC. So the research team, with strenuous efforts, identified from the SWC records most of the important NGOs (36), which are involved in NFE activities. A sort-out of other NGOs from the list will be continued, which it will quite some time. Surprisingly, the SWC recorded only patchy; in other words, they were not complete enough for an inventory. Nevertheless, the research team collected whatever data were available. The identified NGOs will be approached in due course for

further collection of data, which will, no doubt, be an arduous and time consuming task. At present the research team has been able to collect data from 80 NGOs and has filled them in the data form (questionnaire).

The CERID research team traced 12 I-NGOS and 68 NGOs out of the total number of 242 and collected data on each item as contained in the data form by interviewing the related institutional heads. Here again the team faced difficulties in obtaining complete data. This situation clearly indicates the poor data management system in these organizations.

These 80 organizations are located in various districts of Mountain, Hill and Terai regions. The Mountain region includes Jumla, Mugu, Kalikot, Mustang, Rasuwa, Humla and Dolakha, the Hill region Salyan, Pyuthan, Rolpa, Rukum, Surkhet, Baglung, Udayapur, Doti, Dadeldhura, Makwanpur, Dhading, Kavre, Sindhupalanchow, Tanahu, Baglung, Nuwakot, Dhanusha, Okhaldhunga, Parbat, Gorkha, Sindhuli, Kaski and Terthum and the Terai region Bardiya, Kailali, Motottari, Kanchanpur, Janakpur, Parsa, Sunsari, Morang, Rautahat, Bara Siraha, Jhapa, Rupandehi and Sarlahi. Urban areas include Kathmandu and Biratnagar. The following table gives a picture of the location of NGOs and INGOs by region and district.

Forty-six central offices are located in urban areas and district headquarters whereas 34 offices are at the local level (project site). The qualifications of the institutional heads range from Ph. D. to Bachelors degree.

The number of central level staff involved in the project ranges from a minimum of three to a maximum number of 136. At the local level the maximum number stands at 650 -- only one staff in some cases. Financial support to run the activities is provided by various international organizations such as CEDA, IDRC, USC Canada, and Asia Cultural Center for UNESCO, Japan and Rotary International. Also, UN organizations such as UNESCO, UNICEF and UNDP have also provided resources. I-NGOs such as UMN, CEDPA/Nepal, Educate the Children/New York and other private foundations have also provided financial support. Besides, partial financial support is obtained from some potential internal sources.

The objectives of these organizations cover a wide range. Basically, empowerment of disadvantaged and deprived groups is found to be the common objective of these organizations. Since empowerment is a broad concept in which accomplishment of various human development needs is emphasized, the scope of activities, extend wide. Therefore, it is natural that these organizations should have formulated project objectives in a comprehensive manner, which can be categorized broadly as: (1) raising the level of critical awareness of the people on socio-cultural, economic, educational, environmental, and health issues, (2) conducting functional literacy activities with focus on basic lifeskills, (3) conducting productive skills development activities for income generation, (4) organizing environmental preservation activities for sustainable development and (5) energizing people to be perceptive concerning human rights and democracy. However, there are some NGOs whose objectives focus on providing educationally deprived children learning opportunities through alternative schooling programs.

Also, there are some other NGOs (3) which are involved in conducting co-curricular and extracurricular activities for children. (Details of these organizations appear in Appendix 2)

This report also includes a list of 198 NGOs collected from SWC files (See Appendix 3), from which the most relevant ones involved in NFE are being screened.
